Gerald T. “Pete” Langley, 86, of Broken Arrow, died on Monday, December 12, 2016. Funeral services will be held 10:00am on Friday, December 16, 2016, at First United Methodist Church in Broken Arrow, with burial to follow at Elm Cemetery in Leach, Oklahoma. Pete was born On January 31, 1930, in Locust Grove, Oklahoma, the fourth of eight children, to William and Mary Helen (Grider) Langley. He was part of the graduating class of 1949 from Siloam Springs, Arkansas. After graduation he then joined the Air Force and served until 1954.
