Inez Jameson of Tulsa, Ok passed away August 2, 2016. She was born April 5, 1922, in Waldron, AR. Inez graduated from high school in Waldron, AR and college at Conway State Teachers College in Conway, AR. After teaching for ten years in Arkansas, Inez and her husband Bill moved to Oklahoma with their daughter Carolyn. Inez accepted a teaching position in the Berryhill community where she was a beloved teacher for 29 years. After retirement, Inez continued living in Berryhill until 2011 when she moved to Tulsa and lived with Carolyn until November 2015.
