Kenneth Ray White, age 81, passed away on January 27, 2016 in Tulsa, Oklahoma. Ken was born on September 21, 1934 in Tahlequah, Oklahoma to his parents Jess White and Minnie Turner. He was the 3rd of 3 children. Ken received his general education from Torrance High School. After graduation, he served with the Navy from 1951 to 1955 during the Korean War. After his military service, he worked with Texaco from 1955 to 1964, then as a Lineman from 1964 to 1971, as a painter from 1971 to 1995, and as a locksmith from 1995 to 1999. Ken married Edna Winnett on May 14, 1954 in Los Angeles. Ken was a kind, caring, husband, father, and grandfather who cherished his family dearly.
