LaHoma Lois Turner Thompson died Tuesday, December 22 after a short illness. She would have been 85 on her birthday, January 5th. LaHoma was the daughter of Reba (Cannon) Pence and William Carl Pence, and “Jack” Turner. She was preceded in death by her husband, Drue Thompson, her parents, and two babies we never knew. LaHoma grew up in Tulsa and Turley. Although Drue proposed on their first date, she waited until after her graduation from Will Rogers High School in 1949 to marry him. They were married for 54 years. It was a good marriage with much joy, even when together they battled Drue’s Parkinson’s disease. They were a model to their children and grandchildren of what it meant to be committed to one another.
