J B. Creech was born October 7, 1944 to Jesse and Dortha Creech in Wagoner, Oklahoma. He passed into the presence of His Lord and Savior on January 31, 2015. Following graduation from Tulsa Central High School, he became a member of the Oklahoma Air National Guard. As a Medevac, he was involved in transporting the wounded from Vietnam for further medical treatment stateside. J.B. was a long-time employee of American Foundry Group in Bixby, where he served in many capacities through the years, most recently as Special Projects and Implementation Manager. He was a long-time rancher in the Boynton, OK area where he formed many friendships and pursued his love of horses and riding. He is preceded in death by his parents. He is survived by his sister, Peggy Hayes, of the home; and his brother, Randy Creech and wife, Espie of Spring Branch, Texas.
