Theodore Leslie "Les" Turner, Jr., 92, of Tulsa, Oklahoma, died on Wednesday, November 4, 2014. A memorial service will be held at 12:30 PM, on Friday, November 7, 2014 at the Floral Haven Funeral Home Chapel, in Broken Arrow, OK. He was born on July 20, 1922, in Charleston, West Virginia, the son of Theo Leslie and Hazel L. (Jones) Turner.
