Later they settled in Tulsa, OK where he became a member of Oakridge Baptist Church. He later became a deacon in August of 1971. He was a self-employed carpenter building portable buildings for about fifteen years and then bought a Daylight Donuts shop where he worked with his wife and family for twenty years until he retired.
