I also admired his patience with my students, who though untrained in the mechanics of puppetry, were guided and coached by Andrew to assist with the plant in the final scene of the show. In the fall of 2011, he was our featured guest artist and performer at the Broken Arrow Middle School Theatre Festival. The students were completely enthralled with his presentation both on the stage and in the classroom where he instructed them on the basics of puppetry and characterization. His interaction with the students could only be described as joyful. He reveled in sharing his knowledge and passion with others. I am so deeply grieved by the loss of this wonderful person, artist, and friend.
