Dorothy Bernice Carroll was born to William Felix McNair and Clora Jane (Sisco) McNair on March 3, 1918 and passed into eternal rest in our Lord July 4, 2012. She was one of 12 children (6 boys and 6 girls). The family lived up above Osage, AR and Dorothy attended school at Dog Branch and Shady Grove, AR. Dorothy met Louie Carroll at Valley Springs, AR in September 1936 (Dorothy was 19 & Louie 18). They dated until September 26, 1937 when they married at Everton, AR.
