Celebration of Life Service will be 10:00 AM, Friday, January 31, 2020 at Evergreen Baptist Church in Bixby.

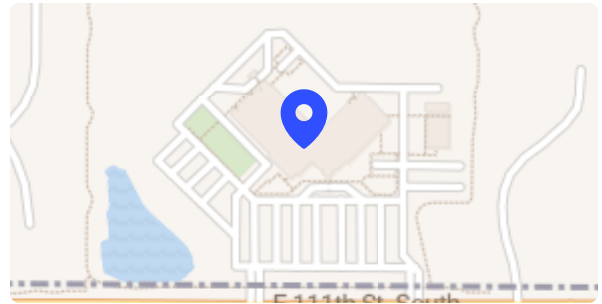
