One of the last things she told one friend was that, after the doctors told her they really didn't know if she would get better or go on home to be with the Lord, Judy replied: "I win either way!" She definitely won when she went home to join her family and her loving Lord.

Her family and friends will miss her greatly. Still, as her friends have reminisced over the last week, we were reminded of the song by Michael W. Smith, "Friends Are Friends Forever, if the Lord is Lord of Them." We are so thankful we can truly say we will be friends with Judy forever.
