Carol Diane Miller, age 65, of Coweta, OK passed away on Tuesday, February 21st at 10:15pm after a nine year valiant battle with Ankylosing Spondylitis and a fearless five month battle with Leukemia.

Carol was born on December 23rd, 1957 in Tulsa, Oklahoma to Derl and Kenny Ann Wood. She attended Owen and Peary Elementary Schools, Foster Junior High School, and graduated East Central High School in 1976. She played softball, took dance and piano lessons, did gymnastics, was a cheerleader, sang in chorus and was active in the youth group at Garnett Church of Christ.

During high school she worked in childcare at the local bowling alley, and worked at the Tulsa World after graduation. As an adult, Carol ran an in-home childcare. Eventually she began her professional career in the natural gas field as a Receptionist where she climbed the corporate ladder to her final position as a Natural Gas Scheduler. Additionally, Carol also worked at the gym as a Personal Trainer.

Carol was an avid runner. She trained and ran countless road races with her Dad including the annual Tulsa Run as well as many half and full marathons. She proudly identified herself as a runner, even having a custom license plate proclaiming the unique experience of the “runner’s high;” ‘RUNRSHI.’
