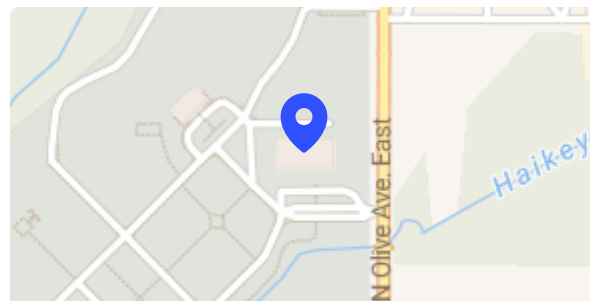

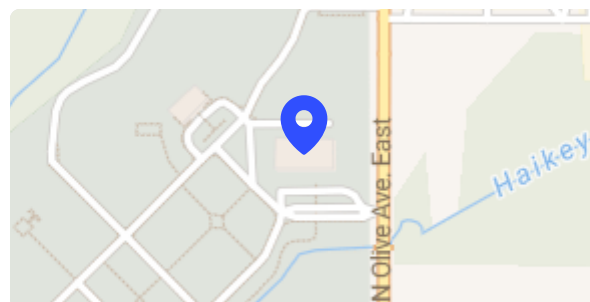

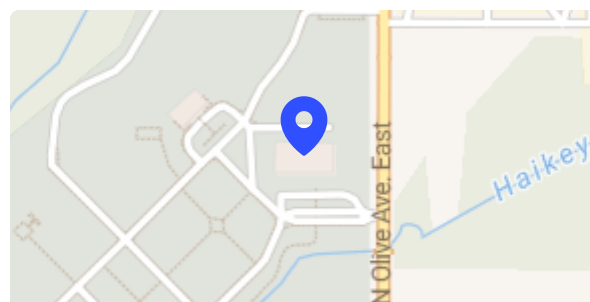

Upon Jim's joining the congregation, the Pastor asked Jim to come forward and introduce himself. He quipped that upon visiting the first time, I was the first person he met, but he decided to stay anyway. Raucous laughter ensued. Jim and I met regularly for breakfast and theological debates until he moved out of state for awhile. Upon his return we renewed our breakfast meetings until health issues intervened.
