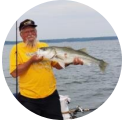
Roger Albert Mistak, a beloved husband, father, grandfather, and friend, passed away on June 18, 2025, in Tulsa, Oklahoma, at the age of 79. He was born on September 18, 1945, in Chicago, Illinois, to Frank Mistak and Anne (Scieszka).

Roger met the love of his life, Judy, in Chicago before joining the U.S. Marine Corps. After his military service, they reconnected and married in September 1969. The couple lived in several places across the country before settling in Stillwater, Oklahoma—knowing it was the right place to raise their family. Roger quickly grew to love the friendly spirit of the people in Oklahoma and appreciated that the state's climate allowed him to enjoy his favorite pastimes—gardening, hunting, and fishing—nearly year-round.
