Fred is survived by his lifelong best friend, Marilyn Smith, a daughter Angela Smith-Tilot, a grandson Robbie Humpert, a sister, Sarah Addington and nephews, Ethan Lindsey MD and Edward G. Lindsey and nieces, Tammy Kirk and Katherine Christian and many great nephews and great nieces. Fred was predeceased in life by his father, Glen Smith Sr., mother Sarah Smith-Pallisard older brother, Glen Smith Jr. and many aunts and uncles.
