While in high school, he attended Tulsa Tech taking classes in Carpentry. He built many things but his most prized possession was a boat which he finally was able to take out on the lake with only a few minor leaks. Kolby loved this boat and fiercely protected it from being sent to the trash on many occasions. In January 2014, Kolby joined the United States Marine Corps. After completing Boot Camp in San Diego, CA, he was stationed in Norfolk, VA, Okinawa, Japan and Camp LeJeune, North Carolina. He was a Corporal in the 1st Battalion 2nd Marines 2nd Marine Charlie Company where he served as an 0311 Infantryman. He recently returned from a deployment with Task Force Southwest in the

Helmand Province, Afghanistan. Kolby brought a smile to everyone he met and loved his family and friends very much. He was always willing to help anyone he could. His energy was contagious and he lived each day to the fullest. It is that smile and sweet face that his family will miss the most.
